### Notification of 2023 Parent Payments

### Dear parent/guardian,

Alphington Primary School is planning for 2023 and would like to advise you of Alphington's School Council approved voluntary financial contributions for 2023. Voluntary contributions have remained the same since 2019 but due to the increases in all costs we will be increasing the Curriculum contributions and Excursion/ Incursion levy. We have seen a marked increase in the costs of paper, books, and other materials as well as increase in costs of entrances, bus costs and providers of incursions.

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students.

School Council has kept the increase to a minimum but felt that these increases were necessary to be able to continue offering our students the opportunities we are able to offer.

### **FREE INSTRUCTION**



## FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES
