We also finished our NAPLAN testing this week with congratulations to the year 3 and 5 students who completed the tests with confidence and persistence. This week we also held the first School Council meeting with the newly formed council. The first meeting was to elect the office bearers and I would like to congratulate Matt Cobby on becoming President, Lisa Godhino on becoming Vice President, Gareth Brodie for continuing as the Treasurer and Thilini Ratnayake for becoming the Secretary. We also welcome Erin Ward as the co-opted community member of the Council. We congratulate this group and look forward to working with the Council across the year.

The Annual Report to the Community was presented last night. The report is a reflection of 2022 and looks at Learning, Wellbeing and Engagement and a few highlights from the year. The reports also gives a snapshot of the schools financial position. All in all, APS has extremely high student data, with high parent satisfaction and high attendance. We are also in a strong financial position. <u>APS Family Mathematics Afternoon</u> Wednesday 5 April 2:15-3:30 2:15-2:40: Maths @ APS Introduction 2:45-3:25: Visit your child/ren's classroom and join in with a mathematics lesson

You are invited to attend our 2023 Family Mathematics Afternoon. On Wednesday 5 April we will be holding an open mathematics afternoon so families can learn a bit more about the teaching of mathematics.

The afternoon will commence with an introduction to Maths @ APS on Level 1 of the Main Administration building. During this session we will outline how we teach mathematics with a couple of little tasks thrown in.

Following the introduction session, families will be invited to visit classrooms and join in with a mathematics lesson. The purpose of this is for families to get involved with their children solving mathematical problems. We look forward to seeing you.

Mathematics @ APS

Alphington Primary School is committed to developing a community of curious and skilled mathematicians. Our aim is to provide a rich, challenging and differentiated teaching and learning program that facilitates strong mathematical content knowledge across the Victorian Curriculum strands; *Number and Algebra, Measurement and Geometry* and *Statistics and Probability,* and develops the four Mathematics capabilities; *understanding, fluency, reasoning, and problem-solving.* The mathematics curriculum aims to ensure that students:

• develop useful mathematical and numeracy skills for everyday life, work and as active and critical citizens in a technological world,

- see connections and apply mathematical concepts, skills and processes to pose and solve problems in mathematics and in other disciplines and contexts,
- acquire specialist knowledge and skills in mathematics that provide for further study in the discipline,
- appreciate mathematics as a discipline its history, ideas, problems and applications, aesthetics and philosophy.

Each Maths lesson provides the opportunity for students to learn, develop and enhance mathematical knowledge and capabilities through practise, explicit teaching, exploration and analysis. Each stage is integral in the facilitation of an effective and engaging lesson.

The Maths lesson Sequence

- 1. Number Fluency an opportunity for students to become proficient in knowledge and understanding. This could be a game to build timetables, a number talk to explore place value, or rapid recall of facts.
- 2. Launch teachers introduce and model new mathematical learning. This may include shared learning experiences, such as solving a problem or working through a sequence of steps to identify patterns and generalisations.
- 3. Explore students working independently, cooperatively or collaboratively to apply their new learning in a range of situations. During this phase teachers will differentiate the learning tasks with enablers and extenders to support each individual learners' needs.
- 4. Summarise (Plenary) Students and the teacher come together to synthesise the learning from the lesson and pose new questions or problems.

NAPLAN Online: We have successfully completed our 2023 NAPLAN assessment period. A big congratulations to all students and teachers for ensuring the week of assessments ran smoothly with only the necessary disruptions to the normal timetable. Results for the assessments will become available some time in Term 2. It is a bit of a process in receiving results, with high level school data provided prior to individual reports being sent to the school and distributed to families.

Harmony Day: This week we celebrated Harmony Day to celebrate the diversity of our school. Students took part in a range of activities focusing on inclusivity and ensure a sense of connectedness and belonging. We will acknowledge Harmony Day at assembly on Friday with a secret presentation also planned, so if you're available to attend please do.


