We've had another busy week with many things happening across the school and yet the students continue to do their best learning and are settled and focused in the classrooms. We celebrated Harmony Week last week and hope that all students have a greater appreciation for each other and the values we hold high here at APS. We really encourage students to take an active role in their school and provide them with opportunities to have a voice. We have a group of students working on the ongoing problem of ball games on the centre turf. They have decided to elicit ideas from students about how this area can be safer for all. The 'low and slow' rule is difficult to follow they tell me and so we are working on a solution together.

Next Wednesday is our Family Maths afternoon. At 2:15 parents are invited into the staff centre to hear about how we teach maths and see some students in action. Following this, parents will have the opportunity to visit classrooms and see maths in action. We have planned this to be both informative and fun for all involved and so we are hoping that most families will be able to have someone attend.

APS Family Mathematics Afternoon - Wednesday 5 April 2:15-3:30

You are invited to attend our 2023 Family Mathematics Afternoon.

On Wednesday 5 April we will be holding an open mathematics afternoon so families can learn a bit more about the teaching of mathematics.

The afternoon will commence with an introduction to Maths @ APS on Level 1 of the Main Administration building. During this session we will outline how we teach mathematics with a couple of little tasks thrown in.

Following the introduction session, families will be invited to visit classrooms and join in with a mathematics lesson.

The purpose of this is for families to get involved with their children solving mathematical problems.

<u>Term 1 Spelling PLC:</u> Professional Learning Communities (PLCs) are an approach to school improvement where groups of teachers work collaboratively at the school level to improve student outcomes.

Professional Learning Community (PLC) schools start from a simple idea: students learn more when their teachers work together.

Building a PLC is a proven way for schools to increase student learning by creating a culture that is:

- focussed on continuous improvement by linking the learning needs of students with the professional learning and practice of teachers.
- committed to professionalism.
- fuelled by collaborative expertise.

Following our professional learning around spelling this term, year level teams focussed on how best to implement the SMART Spelling program to ensure students were efficiently able to develop the metalanguage of spelling (phoneme, grapheme, graph, digraph, trigraph, segmenting, blending) and the explicit teaching sequence when introducing the weekly spelling focus.

Last week during our staff meeting, teams shared their successes with the implementation. Staff reported:

- Students are more engaged during spelling lessons and when completing independent activities.
- Staff have a deeper understanding of linguistics and how to teach spelling.
- Students are taking more risks when spelling and sounding out unknown words, using the metalanguage of spelling to explain their thinking and justify their spelling choices.







Triple P Fear Less Group Program

A free online six-session parenting program for parents of children experiencing anxiety. Open to parents living in the Cities of Darebin, Yarra, Banyule, Nillumbik and Whittlesea.

Fear-Less Triple P supports parents to learn new strategies for managing their child's anxiety. This program is for parents that are concerned about their child's anxiety that would like to learn strategies they can put in place to support the wellbeing of their child and the family.

Content is suited to parents or caregivers of children aged from 6 to 14 years.

The topics covered in this program include:

- · Understanding how anxiety works,
- Becoming the best possible model of anxiety management for their children,
- · Becoming effective emotion coaches,
- Understanding and teaching the value of flexible thinking,
- Managing their children's anxiety effectively, and
- Using constructive coping.

This program will be run in a group setting online with other parents. It will include 6 x 1.5 hour weekly sessions

All families involved will receive:

- Triple P Fear Less Parent Workbook
- Parent Pack including resources for both children and parents to help implement strategies from program
- A \$50 Booktopia voucher to purchase any additional resources
