<u> Principal Update – Melissa Mackenzie</u>

I have written before about the **School Review** that is happening across this term and next. Part of the review involves gathering feedback and ideas from all stakeholders and reflecting on what has been achieved over the last four years. The Education Communication subcommittee of School Council met last night. We looked at the Strategic Plan goals and the targets that were set in 2019. The staff have completed an extensive review of the data and are compiling a report that will be presented to the panel who will complete the review process in term 3. The panel is made up of an independent reviewer employed by the Education Department, our Senior Education Improvement Leader, two Challenge partners who are local Principals, myself, Shane and a School Council representative. The panel will spend three days in the school verifying our report and shaping future goals for the school.

One of the data sets used is the number of Year 3 and 5 students who performed in the top 2 NAPLAN bands in 2022. Here is the data.

90% of our Year 3 students performing in the Top 2 bands is an amazing result. We are compared against similar schools and in every case, we performed better than similar schools. We are very proud of this data and take this as an indication that the programs we implement and the teaching strategies we are using are making a difference to the students at APS. There will be more about the review process in future newsletters. The Strategic Plan is on the website if you would like to read it.

<u>Next week is Education Week - APS OPEN AFTERNOON:</u> we will be celebrating learning on Wednesday afternoon at 2:30-3:15pm when we open the doors for our OPEN AFTERNOON and invite both current and prospective families into classrooms to see learning in action. Please come along if you are able, your children would love to see you or someone in your family. We have advertised in local pre-schools and usually have a lot of families attending. There will be tours run by our Year 6 students for prospective families.

Next Tuesday the staff will acknowledge the work of our Education Support (ES) staff with a morning tea on World Education Support Day. Our ES team- Liliana, Lauren, Lizzy and Andrew all do an amazing job with supporting students and keeping the school ticking along. Our thanks will be shared with them on Tuesday.

<u>Reminder: Next Friday 19 May</u> is our common Professional Practice Day. Students are not required at school. Teachers will be onsite completing analysis of assessments and gathering data for report writing.

Assistant Principal Update – Shane Wilkie

Welcome to week 3 of Term 3. I trust everyone has had an enjoyable week. This week teachers are beginning to plan the next phase of this term's teaching and learning cycle, considering timelines for assessing student learning. This is an important time in the term as we establish the next learning goals for students and check their understanding against curriculum goals set out in the term unit planning. This data will also influence teacher's reporting.

<u>Semester 1 Reporting</u>: Reports will be sent home via Compass on Friday 16 June. Teachers will be preparing reports between Weeks 3 and 8. Families will receive information about reports in the coming weeks. The semester reports will have two main areas for the class teacher to provide information to families. The first is what the student has achieved. This is where teachers provide details as to what the student has achieved across the curriculum areas of English, Mathematics, Integrated Inquiry, and comments on each student's personal and social development. The second box will provide families with areas for improvement, with details as to how this can be achieved.

District Cross Country: The Ivanhoe District Cross Country will be held on Thursday 18 May at Chelsworth Park. The top 10 fastest times in the boys and girls 9, 10, 11 and 12 age groups have been selected and will have received their permission forms via Compass.

Through discussion with Megan and the class teachers, and weather dependent we have planned to hold training sessions during lunch on Thursday and then a follow up session next week on either Monday or Tuesday. Sessions will be approximately 15-20 minutes in length – with activities focussing on race strategy and simulating the length and intensity of the 2km and 3km distances and students' times.

Upcoming Curriculum Events

Science Works: Year 3 students are today on an excursion to Science Works. They will explore the museum and undertake some laboratory sessions exploring the Sun, Earth, and moon.

Bundoora Park Farm: Next Tuesday 16 May, Year 4 students will be visiting Bundoora Park Farm as part of their Integrated Inquiry learning. They will undertake a ride through the wildlife reserve to learn about emus and kangaroos. Do some Handson Garden learning, including composting, worm farms & planting. And finally, scone making, which the children will eat at the end of the program.

The Year 4 Team are still seeking at least two more parent volunteers to attend the excursion. Please see Cassidy (4C) or Jacqui (4B) if you can attend.

STEM Expo: Our annual Science & Technology Expo will be held on Wednesday 7 June. Students in Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 will be working on projects in class as part of their Term 2 Integrated Inquiry Unit. Students in Year 3-6 will also be working on STEM Expo projects in class, however some students in these year levels may have additional tasks to complete as home learning. More information about the STEM Expo will be shared in the coming weeks.

Year 6 Action Teams: Students in Year 6 have continued to develop their Action Teams programs in supporting our local Early Childhood Education providers. Last Friday a group of students visited Yarralea Kindy and lead a range of activities as part of their action plan to give back to our local community. Today we had a group of kindergarten children from Smart Start childcare attend our school and another Action Team lead these children through several games and activities. We are extremely proud of how confident and comfortable students are when working with the younger students, and the time and effort they have put in to supporting and preparing activities.

Sporting School Victoria (SSV) - Team Vic

Hi APS Families,

As some of you may/may not already know, Alphington Primary School is a member of School Sports Victoria (SSV). SSV offers students many opportunities to compete in sports beyond APS. For example, from Year 3 - 6 selected students compete in swimming, cross country and athletics. The level of competition ranges from District, Division, Regionals, all the way up to State.

SSV also has a Team Vic representative program, which provides a development platform for Victorian students to challenge themselves against Australia's best school aged athletes across numerous sports at the annual School Sport Australia (SSA) Championships. SSV coordinates the selection process for Team Vic teams in partnership with relevant state sporting organisations.

At APS we recommend that any students wishing to register to try out for Team Vic play their sport outside of school. Families should first speak to their child's coach about their suitability to trial as they have the best understanding of the child's ability in that sport. Please note that students who are endorsed are generally outstanding players in their sport.

Depending on the sport and team, the selection process involves either:

- Progressive or conference model
- State trial/s
- Results from event/s
- Based on rankings/results or talent identification program
- To be eligible for selection, students must:
- be a full-time student that attends school regularly with School Sport Victoria member school;
- have their registration endorsed by their school Principal;
- be available to attend selection trials and training sessions; and
- meet the costs of participation.


