<u> Principal Update – Melissa Mackenzie</u>

The success of the STEM expo was again outstanding. This event was well attended despite the weather, and it seems the timeslot of 3:45-5:45 works well for families. The celebration of learning from our youngest students to the personal passion experiments in the older years holds testament to how engaging STEM is. Congratulations to everyone for their efforts.

There is still quite a bit of illness in classrooms, and we are appealing to parents to keep their child home if unwell. A day of rest at home can do wonders and stop the spread of the multitude of viruses we are contending with.

Teachers are busy planning for term 3 and all the learning we want to achieve. Term 3 is our usual celebration of the Arts, particularly Performing Arts. We will have our Year 2-6 concert and we have booked the Ivanhoe Girls Grammar School Performing Arts Centre for Thursday 14 September. All year 2-6 students perform with their class, the year 6's act and the STOMP dance teachers support us throughout the process. The Prep / Year 1 concert will be in term 4 this year. Christy is taking Long Service Leave for term 3 and we are in the process of employing her replacement.

At assembly on Fridays, I always look for some positive affirmations for the students. I love this opportunity to acknowledge and recognize those, who often very quietly, make contributions to APS in so many ways. I am keenly watching a group of year 2's who take care of the grounds by picking up rubbish and writing a 'script' for assembly to remind everyone about not taking rubbish into the yard. There are a couple of year 3's who have written me a persuasive letter letting me know that they need more dictionaries in their classrooms. I'm also working with a keen knitter to start a knitting club for a lunchtime. The initiative our students show is inspiring and one of the many reasons that I feel so proud to lead this school.

Assistant Principal Update – Shane Wilkie

I hope you all managed to enjoy the King's Birthday long weekend. I spent the weekend in Brisbane catching up with friends and family and enjoying a little winter break in the warm sunshine and mid 20-degree temperature.

<u>STEM Expo – Scavenger Hunt</u> What an amazing Science Expo we had last Wednesday evening. It was fantastic to see so many students and families moving around the school and engaging with all the wonderful science presentations. The Science Scavenger Hunts were very popular with several entries submitted. It was great to see families and groups of students working together to find the answers. The winners will be announced this Friday at assembly. A big thank you to all the teachers who supported students in preparing their Science Expo displays and for generously giving of their time to ensure the night was such a great success.

<u>Offsite Evacuation Drill</u> –We managed to hold our offsite emergency evacuation drill last Thursday in what ended being a sunshine filled day. Utilising the updated school exits we evacuated the school, arriving at Alphington Park approximately 7 minutes after the alarm was sounded. All staff and students were accounted for, and the drill finalised in under 10 minutes. A fantastic effort. We will maintain the same processes and protocols for the offsite again in semester 2. In term 3 we will hold a lockdown drill as we have number of updates from the previous review to be implemented.

Term 3 Planning: Our staff meetings and team planning time for week 9 is dedicated to the planning and preparation of Term 3. During this time teams are meeting to develop their term unit planners for English, Mathematics, Integrated Inquiry and Wellbeing. Today, teams will meet to plan their Inquiry units. In Term 3 our school wide focus is 'Historical Inquiry'. Students will learn about a period from our past and investigate the impacts events from these times had upon the people, culture and wider society. From this, students will develop a range of skills to compare, contrast, evaluate, and analyse how learning about history can be applied to our lives today.

Bully Stoppers Program: Across the school we are continuing our implementation of the Bully Stoppers Program. Each week a year level has been presenting a message to the school at assembly to reinforce the learning that has been happening in class. We have covered the definition of what bullying is and identifying the features.

The 3 main features of bullying are:

- the misuse of power in a relationship
- it is ongoing and repeated,
- it involves behaviours that can cause harm.

There are four main types of bullying behaviour:

- physical examples include: hitting, pushing, shoving or intimidating or otherwise physically hurting another person, damaging or stealing their belongings. It includes threats of violence.
- verbal/written examples include: name-calling or insulting someone about an attribute, quality or personal characteristic
- social (sometimes called relational or emotional bullying) examples include: deliberately excluding someone, spreading rumours, sharing information that will have a harmful effect on the other person and/or damaging a person's social reputation or social acceptance
- cyberbullying any form of bullying behaviour that occurs online or via a mobile device. It can be verbal or written, and can include threats of violence as well as images, videos and/or audio. For more information, refer to Cyberbullying.

Report Cards: Semester One Reports will be published via Compass on Friday 16 June. An electronic copy of your child's report will be available for you to view online now and download as required from Compass. If you wish to receive a hard copy of the report, please contact your child's class teacher. The reporting on students' achievements for the semester is an important part of the assessment process and each child's individual journey. We recommend families sharing the report with their child, celebrating their achievements, and positively discussing the next learning steps. If you have any questions regarding your child's report, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher.

Hello,


We are the Green Team from Year 3. Our group has been formed because we all think that APS can do better at being more sustainable.


Check-ups start on the 12th July.

Who is eligible?

All students attending government primary, secondary or special schools in Victoria.

w can my child register for the program? Information about the program, along with initial consent forms covering oral health examinations and active preventive care, will be distributed through the school.

When and how will my child be seen?

The Smile Squad team will first visit your school to undertake oral health examinations and active preventive care. Your child will be collected from class when they are due to be seen. After the initial check-up, an individualised treatment plan will be developed and sent home along with a secondary consent form for treatment if needed.

Do I need to attend with my child?

You do not need to attend with your child. However, if you wish to, we can make an appointment time for you to attend together.

What does it cost?

Smile Squad is a free program for all students. It includes an annual oral health check, active preventive care and follow up treatment if needed. Note: this program does not include orthodontic or cosmetic treatment.





WINTER SOLSTICE BONFIRE 2023

The first Winter Solstice Bonfire was held in 2003. This year marks the 20th anniversary of this auspicious occasion!

Saturday 17 June 2023 is when the Bonfire will thrill and delight thousands of families.

There is something hypnotic about watching flames leaping into the night sky from a massive bonfire. When live music, fire lanterns, facepainting and storytelling are added to the mix. It's truly an evening to remember.

We'll also have a widely expanded range of vendors selling food and drinks, including: Beatbox Kitchen, Blak Brews, The Boiling Crab, Hot Churros, Hudsons Donuts, Inkredible Calamari, Juicello, Mr Fresh Truck, Taco Truck, Twista Bros, Twista Sis, Wrap It Roll It and friends of the Farm—the Country Women's Association.

And as always, the Farm will be running a BBQ sausage sizzle (with sausages supplied by Halal Meats Preston) and a bar with beer, wine and our special mulled wine. Drinks will be provided by Bodriggy, Mountain Goat, Rewine and Noisy Ritual Winery.

This event sells out fast and tickets are available online only via our website and direct from Eventbrite.

Prices are: Adults \$25 / concession \$15 Kids \$15 / concession \$10 Children under the age of 2 are admitted for free. These cards entitle you to concession-priced entry: Carer Card, Health Care Card, Pension Card and Veterans' Affairs Card. This is a card-only event. Strictly no cash. No dogs or glow sticks permitted on site.

The Farm will be closed during the day on Saturday17 June while we prep for the big event, until gates open at 4:00 pm for Winter Solstice Bonfire ticket holders only.

This event ends at 8:00 pm.

We strongly advise taking public transport to the Bonfire as parking is extremely limited. The closest train station is Victoria Park on the Mernda/Hurstbridge lines, with a 10-minute walk from the station. Buses 200–207 from the city to Bulleen go along Johnston Street regularly. Paid parking is available in the Abbotsford Convent carpark, however, numbers are limited—so again, we strongly advise to look for alternative modes of transport.
