## **Principal Update – Melissa Mackenzie**

It has been a lovely start to the week with our annual Fun Run yesterday. We were so lucky with the weather! The students showed great determination and persistence as they completed some long-distance running. Some of the younger students were hard to stop and they completed many more laps than the one they were asked to do. In fact, I needed to stand in the middle of the course and tell some of them to stop running! Their enthusiasm and support of each other made me feel proud. Thanks to Megan for her organisation and to the many parents who came along to help or to watch the event.

As you will have read last term, we are having terrible trouble finding replacement staff. Very late last year Nisha left APS and we have tried multiple times unsuccessfully, to employ a new Performing Arts teacher. We have had CRT's and have managed to provide a very basic program. We are now in conversations with companies who will come into the school and provide a short term program for the year 2-6 students for next term. We have also employed Christy for another day to teach Performing Arts for the Prep and Year 1 students, she is not able to teach the whole school Performing Arts as most of her time is teaching Visual Arts. You will see Katie Goldwater back from Family leave for this term as she is providing planning time for the teachers, usually gained when the students go to Performing Arts. While it is unfortunate that we have been unable to employ a suitably qualified Performing Arts teacher, we believe that utilising a company with expertise in performance and production will allow us to provide the best possible opportunities for our students this year.

I have reminded parents a few times through the newsletter about paying school charges and that the excursion/ incursion levy is user pays. Families who have not paid this levy will be receiving a letter this week. Please pay as soon as possible and contact the school if you would like to arrange a payment plan.

APS is a polling booth for 21 May election and the School Council are holding a BBQ/ cake and coffee stall. There is a flyer in the newsletter and more information on Compass. It will be an opportunity for the community to see the gym and enjoy a sausage.

There has been some confusion about the easing of restrictions and what that means for students at school. Students and staff who are household contacts of a positive COVID-19 case are no longer required to quarantine. They can return to school as long as they undertake rapid antigen tests (RAT) 5 times within their 7-day period and wear face masks indoors if they are aged 8 and above unless they have a valid exemption. If during the 7 days they return a positive RAT they must then isolate for the required 7 days. Please contact the school if you are unsure.

## **Assistant Principal Update – Shane Wilkie**

I hope everyone has settled back into the routine of school following the Easter Break. On Friday we held our Anzac Day commemoration as part of our weekly assembly. It was a wonderful commemorative service led by our Year 6 Student Leaders. A special acknowledgement to all students, who demonstrated wonderful respect and listening for the duration of the assembly.

**Wellbeing Student Data:** As part of our continued work to support students' well-being and achievement of the personal and social capability curriculum, staff have been analysing student data gathered through our end of Term 1 Wellbeing Check-in. The termly survey provides insight into how students are feeling about school from both a personal and interconnected sense. Yesterday staff met in teams to analyse our first collection and set some draft goals in response to the data. During weekly 4Rs lessons, Circle Time, and extra curriculum opportunities, staff will work with students on goals to support students with their wellbeing and learning dispositions. Some themes that were identified to focus on included:

- *Being positive in trying different strategies when faced with a challenge in new learning*
- *Developing a positive self-esteem and view of ourselves as learners*
- *Understanding that learning is a continuum and being a good learner does not necessarily mean receiving the highest or best marks*

**Learner Dispositions:** As part of our continued efforts to support and develop students' learning and wellbeing we are developing our understanding of learner dispositions. Today I would like to introduce you to two learner dispositions that have been identified through research as those that can support students to become agents of their learning.



Mindful  
Agency

*Mindful Agency is taking responsibility for your own learning. It's about how you manage your feelings, your time, our energy, your actions and the things you need to achieve your goals. It's knowing your purpose — then knowing how to go about achieving it; stepping out on the path towards your goals.*



Hope and  
Optimism

*Hope and Optimism is being confident that you can change and learn and get better over time. It is helped by having a positive learning story to reflect upon, that gives you a feeling of having 'come a long way' and of being able to 'go places' with your learning.*

**APS FUN RUN:** Yesterday we held our APS Fun Run. For students in Years 3-6, the event was also an opportunity to trial for the District Cross Country team. All times for these students were recorded, and the 10 fastest students for each age group will be selected to compete at the District Cross Country event.

Students ran in house groups again this year, with lots of fun, support, and friendly competition. We were joined by the children from Yarralea Kindergarten, who ran a lap with our Prep students and Year 6 Kindy Action Team. Congratulations to all students for participating and competing in such a positive way.

A big thank you and acknowledgement to all those parents and families who attended either as volunteers or supporters. It is wonderful to be able to be back holding community events such as these.

Our PE teacher, Megan, did a fabulous job in organising the event, and has compiled the list of students who will progress to District trials to be held next Monday 9 May.

**NAPLAN Online:** From Tuesday 10 May students in Years 3 and 5 will undertake NAPLAN online assessment tests.

NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents and carers to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia.

At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress.

Federal, state and territory education ministers agreed to gradually transition NAPLAN online by 2022. NAPLAN online is a tailored test that adapts to student responses, providing better assessment and more precise results. The NAPLAN Online platform is designed for students to undertake tests in the following order: Writing, Reading, Conventions of Language and Numeracy.

Year 3 students will complete their writing assessment using traditional pencil and paper format, while students in year 5 will use the online platform.

All classes have spent considerable time ensuring students have had opportunities to use the NAPLAN Online platform under practice test conditions. We have also spent time ensuring students are comfortable leading into the NAPLAN period, reassuring them that these are point in time assessments and that they simply try their best.

# LET'S GET RECYCLING!

Alphington Primary School is excited to be participating in the *Wonder Recycling Rewards* program again this year. Last year we collected just over **15kg** of bread bags and hundreds of bread tags, giving us a total of 1500 credits to spend towards RH Sports equipment.

We would love to get the ball rolling early and start collecting bread bags and tags now. But of course, we cannot do this without your help. A collection box has already been set up in your child's classroom, so please start collecting at home and feel free to send them in weekly!

## TWO RECYCLING REMINDERS

It's important that items being recycled are not contaminated with other products and are as clean as possible. Here's a quick checklist for you:

### What is a bread bag for recycling purposes?

The rule of thumb is that if it has contained bread of some sort and is a soft plastic, then it's a bread bag. If it hasn't contained bread, then it's not a bread bag.

### How clean do the bags have to be?

Bread bags should be free from crumbs to ensure no contamination during the recycling process but they do not need to be washed.

Children require a pair of dance shoes to protect their feet during classes. These are available for a further \$35. No other uniform is required but bike shorts are a good idea under school dresses.
